203. Declarations of Interest

- 204. <u>Minutes</u> of the Meeting 9 January 2017: All members had received copies of the minutes. RESOLVED that they be approved and signed as a true record.
- 205. <u>Matters Arising</u> 192(iv) Request for financial donation The Counselling Centre: further information has been received and it was noted that in the 2015/2016 F/Y 2% of new intakes were from Borough Green. RESOLVED that a £50 donation will be made in the 2017/2018 F/Y.

206. Period for Public Consultation

Concern was raised about the dangerous speed of traffic along Western Road with vehicles often mounting the footway. Chairman advised that the Police will not do speed checks in that location and speed indicators are not effective. The parish council totally agrees with the concerns but more responsibility is needed by drivers and passing motorists are difficult to educate in this respect. Next year residents of Western Rd will have the opportunity to participate in the Speedwatch campaign. Cllr Perry suggested that, a year on from the Red Lion development, the time might now be right to request a traffic review.

Further concerns were raised about the safety of the crossing opposite the Recreation ground and the extremely dirty state of road signs. Regarding the latter, although this is the responsibility of Kent Highways, residents are free to clean if they wish.
