Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd

September 2025

Yesterday I found myself thinking about the pressures we experience in everyday life: everyday things like washing, cooking, cleaning that keep the home going smoothly - if they get done that is! And then the outside ones: work – for me church ministry and painting or the admin that goes with it! For others, it might be having work versus can't get a job or being unsatisfied in some way about the current one. Or family needs and expectations - that's a difficult one, as they may be different to mine, financial pressures and uncertainties about the future, health issues and just finding time to be with friends and chill out... It will all spring back into focus as we go into September. Holiday over, for those of us privileged to have one, children at school, and back to our everyday life as we generally know it.

How do we deal with all that? How do we manage other people's expectations when they differ from ours? How do we cope with the pressures we feel? It's easy to think when we feel under the cosh that nobody understands. In fact Jesus took time out of a busy ministry, went off with his disciples to pray and teach them, but the crowds followed. He hopped on a boat and crossed the Sea of Galilee with the twelve disciples to escape the crowds - ever felt like that? – and exhausted, he fell asleep on the way. There was a storm too on that crossing, which he calmed, and that terrified the disciples even more. What sort of person can do that?

So, Jesus knows what it is to be weary, under pressure, in need of comfort and rest. All because he often experienced opposition, misunderstanding, and eventually died at the hands of those who did not accept his ministry and teaching. There is much that we can do for ourselves, but this same Jesus invites us to come to Him and lay down our concerns at His feet. 'Come to me all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ... Learn from Me', he says in St Matthew's Gospel (Ch 12), 'and you will find rest for your souls'.

We need rest and peace for our minds, bodies and spirits in this unpredictable world. So, as the autumn speeds up again, I invite you to take a few minutes whenever you can, to stop, breathe deeply and commit the next hour, your day, your way to Christ and ask for His peace and guidance. He will be there for you and, if we can help in some way at the Good Shepherd, do get in touch.

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council



The Council met at 7.00pm Tuesday **4th August 2025** at the COGS Annexe. Matters raised included:

• Recreation Ground Pavilion. Our new Cllr Nikki Proto has been appointed as Project Manager because of her extensive construction industry background, in particular Building Regulations. She will be assisted by Chair Mike Taylor who has experience at the bricks and mortar level in local projects. Nikki's first recommendation was that we need a Disability Audit which has been contracted and will happen in the next couple of weeks. Whilst, as a culturally important existing building, we don't have to comply with DDA legislation, the PC felt it was important to make the building as accessible as possible for all residents. A new ramp will be constructed to the south of the Pavilion, the new doors planned will allow some disabled access right into the building, and modifications made to the toilets. Honeycomb Construction will commence a major refurbishment of the roof this year with a view to getting the building weather tight by winter. We will also be installing new matching handrails to ensure the whole veranda is as safe as possible.

Bernie the Clerk is using his well honed skills seeking grant aid from various quarters, including local businesses, to support the cost of the refurbishment, including the internal work that will start next year.

It is hoped that the renewed building will provide a venue for PC meetings, a space that is useable by the community voluntary enterprises and perhaps a chance for someone to set up a tea and ice cream café during the summer months to deal with the ever-growing number of families using the Recreation Ground.

- Isles Quarry East. Unbeknownst to us all, an enterprising group of youngsters have constructed an amazing mountain bike track in an inaccessible area of IQE. We have been extremely impressed with the quality of their work and the clean and tidy state of the area. Mr Tony Byrne has approached the PC with a view to regularising this enterprise and also providing a similar but less testing area for younger cyclists in another inaccessible area on a lower level. Both groups will be run as an informal club, the sole requirement being registration of a contact number for a parent in case of accidents. There will be a secure first aid box installed on site and a system put in place to dispose of the rubbish the users have been collecting. A licence will be signed formally this month. The PC was unanimous in praising the efforts of the young people and to Tony for the hard work he has already put in making access paths safe and clear. It will also give young people fresh air, exercise and adventure.
- Conyerd Road residents and the Parish Council have been working together to clear some of the undergrowth and ivy blocking pavements and sightlines at the Conyerd Rd junction with Quarry Hill Rd. There are a couple of trees that look in a precarious state, a danger to pedestrians and traffic. We have contacted Treeability, our arboreal consultants, to assess these trees and a decision will (Continued on page 11)

then be taken if they need to be made safe, and we are considering invoking our powers as an authorised agent of Kent Highways to tackle works on KCC or private land adjacent to the highway. The relevant landowners have been tracked down through Land Registry and will be notified.

- Resilience Planning. Cllr Sue Butterfill will be heading up the Parish Council's Resilience Planning, so we will have plans in place for civil emergencies such as flooding and snow, but also when we have water and power outages. There are always public spirited people who will step up when needed but we need a scheme in place to co-ordinate these efforts and a register of those essential volunteers.
- Civil Enforcement Officers have been very visible in the village in past
 weeks since we committed funds and joined this TMBC scheme. The CEOs
 have been visiting the High St, the village hall area, the station and the
 Recreation Ground and, as the system beds in, we will be getting monthly
 reports.
- **Skatepark.** A major refurbishment of the flatbank complex is nearing completion, part of our rolling upgrade. KAS Welding is the Joint Parishes contractor, and we are converting the worn and rotting ply surfaces to galvanised steel. It was heartening to see how well the steelwork on the internal frames has survived 20 years of hard use, the only maintenance needed was a quick wire brush in places and a lick of paint. What was particularly heartening to see was that James, working with Barry Cox of KAS Welding, was one of the Drop-in teenagers who back in 2004 helped plan, build and install the skatepark now a grown-up family man in his own right.

It is worth recalling that we built a £120,000 skatepark for just £40,000 including the concrete base and fencing because of the voluntary work and generosity of young people and local tradesmen, a real triumph for our "DIY Village".

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 1st September at 19.30 in the COGS Annexe. The agenda will include a period for public contributions and questions.

safety hazard. The planter had also suffered multiple bumps over the years and was severely damaged in places. A section of the Oak trunk was sawn into planks and has been used for commemorative benches around the village. Acorns had been potted up so the Oak lives on at Potters Mede.

The Parish Council sought advice from KMOTT, KCC and our own tree specialist about species that were more tolerant to water shortage. A shortlist of 10 species were given to us, we consulted the village and the resulting choice was an Acer Palmatum and its red foliage really stands out.

A new planter was built using local Kent Ragstone, incorporating a historic AA marker sign from the old planter, and a piece of ragstone commemorating the Rock public house. The Rock PH (1841 - 1992) was famous because when it was built there was a lump of ragstone too big to remove, so they just built the front wall up and over it, and it became a feature both outside and inside in the public bar.

Trackers

Officers were able to locate property that was stolen during a recent burglary by utilising a tracker that the owner had strategically placed within. This allowed us to find and return their possession. The discovery was made when the owner of the property, which was an expensive set of golf clubs on this occasion, guided officers whilst tracking them on his mobile phone.

Here is a breakdown of why trackers are so popular and valuable:

1. Finding Lost Items

- Track your essentials such as keys, wallets, bags, or even slip them into luggage. If you misplace something, the tracker helps you locate it quickly.
- Using a Phone App: Both AirTag and Tile have companion apps that show the last known location of the item on a map.

2. Preventing Loss

 Separation Alerts: Some models (like Tile Pro or Apple AirTag with certain iOS settings) notify you if you leave an item behind, like your backpack at a coffee shop.

3. Community Finding Networks

- Apple AirTag: Uses the massive Find My network of Apple devices around the world. If someone else's iPhone is near your AirTag, it can update its location anonymously and securely.
- Tile Network: Works similarly, but with a smaller network unless you are in a densely populated area.

4. Travel Convenience

- Luggage Tracking: You can check if your bag made it onto the plane or is stuck at the airport.
- Peace of Mind: Especially useful in crowded places or during international travel.

5. Pet and Kid Safety (With Caveats)

- Pets: Attach to a pet's collar to help find them if they wander off.
- Kids: Some parents use them to keep tabs on young children in public spaces (though they're not substitutes for GPS trackers with real-time updates).

6. Anti-Theft Use

 You can hide a tracker in valuable items (like bikes or cars) to help recover them if stolen.

I encourage residents to consider placing trackers in belongings such as wallets, vehicles and other high value items.
