Complete infill would certainly not be supported.

Dedicated pathway required, 4, Concern about loss of beach hedge. 5. Stability of bank and adjacent highway is of concern if bank cut away.

Pedestrian Crossings 148.

A letter from Kent Highways was received: noted that a detailed design for a Pelican crossing west of the Red Lion is to be undertaken. Chairman has queried location of proposed speed indicator device also at this location. Await further information and results of subsequent safety audit.

Technicalities regarding the construction of the pedestrian crossing A227 noted. Kent Highways will be reminded that High Street weight restriction must be reinstated on

completion of works.

Chairman will speak to the Rural Constable about 'Speedwatch'.

Fairfield Road/Station Approach footpath link 149

A letter from the Land Registry was received and options for registering land were noted.

Chairman will meet with T&MBC to discuss their powers of acquiring land.

Financial Assistance - Church of the Good Shepherd 150

As it is understood that the church has received another donation towards their printer, Chairman proposed that a PC donation of £750 be made in place of the £1,500 raised 5 July 2004 but not presented. Agreed.

Recreation Grounds

Bowls Club: Chairman, Clir Hughes and Clerk met with club representatives: as the PC has been paying for the club's water supply for many years it was agreed that the club will now pay water a/cs in full for the next 5 years. A decision re, installing a mater will then be taken. Tree surgery - Rec. Gd: Tenders were received from Duncan Simpson Treeservices Ltd and Marks Plants. Chairman proposed that the tender of Duncan Simpson in the sum of £480 + VAT be accepted. Agreed.

Tennis courts - A letter from the Tennis Club was received: resurfacing of courts is now considered essential. The club will be asked to explore possible grants available to them. Updated scheme for floodlights was noted: agreed to proceed with planning application. Cricket square maintenance: Cllr Hughes proposed that a quotation from KCC for cricket square maintenance 2005 be accepted in the total sum of £556.50 + VAT. Seconded by Clir Willsher. Agreed.

Mower: Noted that a replacement rotary mower is required. Cllr Willsher proposed that a Hayter 22" rotary mower be purchased form Kidman's for the sum of £703.92 + VAT.

Seconded by Clir Hughes. Agreed.

Potters Mede pavilion: There is concern about deterioration of pavilion. Chairman proposed that a structural survey be undertaken. Agreed. More intense routine maintenance is required.
