

WOODLAND WALK RECREATION GROUND BOROUGH GREEN PARISH COUNCIL TN15 8HE



The recreation ground was purchased in January 1934 for £420 from a local builder. The Memorial Pavilion was built in 1955 with a donation from the Women's Institute and a Government War Memorial Grant. The Woodland Walk was a piece of ancient woodland originally part of the Basted House Estate. Basted House was owned by the Monckton family, who also owned Basted Paper Mill, just south of the village. Mr Monckton donated the woodland to the Parish, which is why we have a Monckton Rd dedicated in the 1960s. Two foot bridges were built across the Bourne, and connecting paths run through the woodland, creating a tranquil walk. The trees on the Pavilion side are protected by TPO.
