Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd

February 2026

Well and a Happy New Year to all our readers! I can't believe how quickly Christmas flew by. It was a good one here at the Good Shepherd and our prayers are that 2026 will bring peace to each one of you and also to our troubled world.

I am writing this just after we have celebrated the 120th Anniversary of the Church of the Good Shepherd. Anniversaries of course are important - time to take stock, to reflect on what has been good, what we might change, how we got to this point and where next?

The Good Shepherd was founded by Christians from St George's Church in Wrotham and the foundation stone laid on 9 January 1906. The building itself was consecrated only 7 months later on 24 July 1906, quite an achievement. Since then, there have been 13 clergy - 9 curates from St George's and, since 1966, 4 vicars, currently none as you know, and hundreds of people who have visited, worshipped and served in the parish to whom we owe much. Now it is our turn to work to serve this community and share our faith – you can check the following pages to see what is available to anyone in this locality.

So what does this anniversary mean? As we give thanks, we also think about the future and pray for God's guidance. Many ask when we will have a new vicar. We don't know is the answer but as we met this morning for our regular service and added a nice lunch - an anniversary after all! - we are clear that the future needs to involve us all. Anniversaries provide a thinking space - time to reflect. So I invite you to do the same for yourself as we begin this year 2026. Some ideas to consider are:

What matters most in your life?

Are you paying it attention or neglecting it?

Were your resolutions the important ones, or can they be ditched for something else?

Where do you find direction?

Is it a helpful place?

Have you ever considered that God might offer you help/support/guidance, whatever you wish to call it, in a key moment?

Have you ever prayed to find the answer?

In my own life, key moments have often been very ordinary - a short conversation at a bus stop, or in a phone call or ... I could say more. The important thing to find our way, is to be open and listening - listening to wise friends and open to God for new ways forward.

'When a great moment knocks on the door of your life, it is often no louder than the beating of your heart, and it is very easy to miss it.' wrote **Boris Pasternak**, Russian author and poet.

So my challenge this month is to listen. Are you listening too?

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council



The Council met at 7.30pm Monday 5th January 2026 at the COGS Annexe. Matters raised included:

- **Declaration of Town Status.** We have had a terrific response, online, email and paper slips. All votes were counted by two Councillors prior to the meeting and the breakdown of the **592** votes was announced by the Clerk: "Support changing to a Town" **375**, "Against changing" **200** and "Undecided" **17**. The Chairman then proposed a formal vote and the Council agreed unanimously to adopt Town Status on 1st April 2026 to coincide with our financial year end. The Clerk will change bank accounts to "Borough Green Council" so we can change back quickly if we wish and the decision will be reviewed every 6 months. Our grateful thanks to everyone who took part.
- **Recreation Ground Pavilion.** Roof replacement and clock tower are complete. Cllr Proto and the Clerk are submitting plans and putting together a business case for grant applications. We hope to start the disabled access ramp shortly, with the main works starting in the Spring.
- **Isles Quarry bike club** plans have been put on hold temporarily whilst TMBC decide if we need "Planning Permission for Development in the Greenbelt!" (but it has been too wet to work anyway). Action by TMBC Planning Enforcement means at present we can't even risk putting down log chippings on the muddy sections of path or installing the planned signage that will make it safer for all users.
- **A Volunteer Wildlife Warden** was proposed, and BGPC have appointed Cllr Lisa Reid to take on the role for Isles Quarry, Harrison Rd and Crowhill. Her brief is based on the Kent Wildlife Survey and we will be providing extra training.
- **Potters Mede & Scouts.** BGPC are working closely with the Scouts to enable them to build their new permanent home at Potters Mede. Our original plan was to build south of the existing building but that part of the site is constrained by the underground services, the stream on the boundary, and reduces the safe green play space for children. So we are now looking at siting the new building in the car park and joining both areas of car park together to increase the available car parking for all hall users.
- **TMBC Local Plan Reg 18 Consultation.** BGPC agreed and submitted its own response and endorsed the Parish Alliance Contamination report and the Soft Sand Reserves report - all posted on the website.
- **Christmas Lights Switch-on Festival** on Saturday 29th November was a great success - our usual vote of thanks to the Christmas Lights volunteers.

- **Borough Green Sandpits.** Mud and other debris on the A25 continue to be a safety hazard. Cllr Rayner is working with KCC Enforcement to try and bring an end to this unacceptable problem. One element will be a new Quarry Liaison Group that will meet regularly with the operator in the hope that the personal touch may bring results.
- **Nepicar Sandpit** has submitted an application to extract sand west of their current pit towards Platt Industrial Estate. BGPC and Platt PC strongly support the application which could further delay the eventual restoration of the pit, constraining the area's suitability for development.
- **4x4 Santa.** Our thanks to Cllr Butterfill and South East 4x4 for Santa's visit to Platt and Borough Green, where over 300 children came out for their treats.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Monday 9th February 2026 at 19.30 in the COGS Annexe.** The agenda will include a period for public contributions and questions.





Tom Tugendhat MP's Column

December 2025

The Rt Hon Sir John Stanley, who served our community for 41 years, has died at the age of 83 following a short illness. Sir John served Tonbridge and Malling as MP between 1974 and 2015. He dedicated much of his life to our concerns and cared deeply. I have learned so much from so many who have shared stories of his dedication to responding to those who needed his help.

One of Sir John's many achievements was his vigorous opposition to the plans at Borough Green Sandpits for a 250 acre freight terminal, towards the end of the 2000s. Many will recall his passionate speech in Wrotham School at the public meeting at the time which showed just how deeply he cared for our community.

He also served with distinction in Parliament on the Foreign Affairs Committee and as a Minister in government. Sir John had the privilege, as Margaret Thatcher's PPS, of being the one who welcomed her into Number 10 for the first time. He went on to bring through the law allowing council tenants to buy their homes, the biggest transfer of wealth in a generation. From there he went on to serve as the Minister for the Armed Forces in the Ministry of Defence and later as a Minister in the Northern Ireland Office. His unique style brought change and focus to each role. He served our country with distinction.

Even after he stepped down he was a kind friend and counsel to me and was the best predecessor I could ask for. No issue was too big or small for Sir John to deal with. In Parliament he was devoted to serving his country in the same way he served our community. I know I will not be alone in missing Sir John, he helped many of us in Kent and across the United Kingdom. His life was one of dedication and service. I send my deepest condolences to Elizabeth and to his whole family.

January 2026

At Christmas many of us were lucky to spend time with family, friends and loved ones. For some of us, distance makes that harder and that's where technology comes in, but that relies on having fast and reliable broadband. That's a long way from universal. As so many of us know, there are still many areas in our community where the signal is appalling and a very real challenge for those of us living here.

Last year I started a survey to understand the extent of the problem affecting our rural villages. I have had around 1,000 people get in touch with me. Thank you if you have shared your experiences. It has informed my work and allowed me to map best where the issues are.

The frustration of having no data, even when your phone indicates you should have coverage, can be a daily struggle. This affects us whether we are making calls from our phones or using unreliable Wi-Fi.

The technology phone companies use allows for high-speed capacity across our area. Phone companies can make our signal better if they want to invest in our community. In every meeting I have held with operators since launching the survey, I have made this point. It is simply a failure to act from the companies who provide the service. That's why we need to keep the pressure on them.

Whilst EE and VodafoneThree are both expecting significant upgrades in the next few years, Virgin Media O2 are working on timelines of 8 years. This is far too long to wait.

I've escalated this in Parliament because, sadly, it isn't just our community affected. Rural areas across the country suffer from slow broadband and poor connectivity. Even in our towns, the issues are seen. Many people can't even get a phone signal to pay for parking or access shopping apps in the middle of Tonbridge. Train journeys are often disrupted by lost signal.

As I continue to build the picture to present a case to the mobile phone companies, I would appreciate your help in telling me your experiences. 

Local Plan. The consultation has now closed, thank you to everyone for your comments. All comments received will be reviewed and considered alongside the supporting evidence as we continue to develop the Plan. We are analysing the consultation responses and carrying out further technical work where required. This will inform the next stage of the process, known as Regulation 19, when a proposed final version of the Local Plan will be published for consultation before submission to the Government for independent examination.

YOUR COUNCILS CHANGE IS COMING... Local Government Reorganisation

Further to the article in the October edition of the Voice, at the end of November KCC, Medway Council and the 12 district and borough councils in Kent submitted their proposals to Ministers for the preferred number of new unitary councils needed in the county and the geographical areas they should cover. The number of options have increased somewhat as follows :-

- a) single authority for the whole of the county - proposed by KCC,
- b) three authorities - proposed by TMBC and 4 other councils,
- c&d) four authorities - two options with different boundaries each proposed by 3 councils,
- e) five authorities - proposed by 2 councils.

TMBC's preference includes a West Kent authority consisting of Sevenoaks, Tonbridge & Malling, Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells. For details for the various proposals go to <https://kentcouncilleaders.org.uk>.

Ministers are expected to analyse the proposals and launch a public consultation early this year. A decision by the Government on the final structure of unitary councils is expected in the summer.
