85. Borough Green & Platt Bypass/Traffic Matters

Cllr D Evans raised concern about the haul road. Now that the quarry is no longer in regular use, it is not being adequately cleaned and is becoming a site for fly tipping. Closure of this road, which is legally used by local people, would have a devastating effect on the village and, in particular, Quarry Hill Road which could not safely take the additional traffic. Adoption of the road is a matter for extreme urgency. A letter will be sent to County Cllr Mrs Dagger with copies to KCC, T&MBC and Ightham PC.

Results of pedestrian crossing counts from KCC were received and discussed. Further clarification will be requested.

A letter from a Sevenoaks resident re. the Otford slip roads was noted.

Cllr Taylor left the meeting.

A reply from T&MBC re. traffic issues was read. There is still concern about lack of speed restriction measures on the A25.

A reply from T&MBC re. parking issues was read. Discrepancy between parking charges Western Road car park and railway station car park will be queried.

86. Vacancy BGPC

No election has been called. Mrs H Chiswell has expressed an interest in becoming a co-opted member. Chairman proposed that she be formally asked to join the Parish Council. Agreed.

87. Audit of Accounts 2001/2002

The audit has been completed but the report is still awaited. For consideration at the next meeting.

88. Recreation Ground

Pavilion: Further to the consultant's report, agreed that sports clubs will be contacted to assess need/support for a new building. Chairman and Cllr McWilliam will prepare a report for 'The Voice'.

Woodland Walk: Tenders for the construction of the paths have been invited.

Beech Hedge: The contractor due to cut the beech hedge, will also be asked to remove the tree growing into the tennis court fencing.

89. Potters Mede

Sign: Chairman proposed that a new name-board be purchased for the frontage of Potters Mede, all as before. Agreed.
