### Recreation Grounds

Rec. Gd. Pavilion: Re-roofing works have commenced. Entrance gates: Due to poor state of repair, agreed to request Hyders to remove and advise on possible refurbishment. Use of ground: Request to hold a funfair during a summer weekend was agreed in principle although it is felt that Whitegate Field would be more suitable. This will be suggested and further details requested. Drainage: Agreed that remedial works at the entrance to the children's play area have now been completed satisfactorily.

Potters Mede pavilion: Refurbishment works are due to commence on 28 February 2006. Use of building: Installation of mirrored walls in the committee room for the benefit of dance groups, may be considered at a later date. Further details will be requested from the hirer. Copies of a written request to hire the facilities for a nursery group will be given to all members.

For consideration at the next meeting.

A request to use the car park for 6no staff cars Monday-Friday was received from Platform Rentals. Chairman proposed that this be agreed 1 Sept-31 March at a total charge of £30/wk. Agreed. Water supply: Emergency works were required to rectify a substantial water leak under the car park surface. Chairman approved acceptance of a quotation from Waterlink in the sum of £225 + VAT call-out charge & 2 hrs labour and £75/hr subsequent time. Action agreed. Noted that drainage pipes generally were found to have become very brittle and liable to develop faults.

There then followed the period for public consultation.

The Parish Council reiterated its support for the new Celcon factory building, subject to the relevant authorities being satisfied as to emissions.

The condition of the road through Basted Mill was raised. The Parish Council agreed to refer this to the Basted Mill Public Open Space Joint Committee and Kent Highways. A resident has expressed an interest in forming an environmental action group in Borough

Green to provide practical input into enhancing the village. Any person interested in joining the group should contact the Clerk.
