Construction/maintenance items were raised. Recreation Ground: Noted that benches could be constructed for approx £40/50 each; urgent repairs are required to the pavilion roof and a light on the pavilion was suggested. Street nameplates are required for Tollgate and Lendon Road/Staleys Acre.

A recent BG-TAG march was well supported. A bypass update from KCC is awaited. The

group confirms its support for the Speedwatch initiative.

Further agreed that, in the interim, essential repairs will be carried out to the roof.

Potters Mede pavilion: Due to lack of response, tenders for refurbishment works were invited for a second time. 2no tenders were received from the 8no invited. All members received copies of the schedule of tenders. After discussion Chairman proposed that the tender of Simmonds of Wrotham be accepted for refurbishment of the toilet areas, including replacement sanitary fittings all in accordance with the itemised tender. Agreed Potters Mede hire charge: Agreed that there can be no reduction for BGFC in lieu of marking-out the pitches.
