Play equipment inspections: Future regular inspection programme for playground equipment was discussed. Clerk reported on advice received from T&MBC. Agreed to obtain written approvals of adopted regime from H&S authority and insurance company. Further advice will be sought from T&MBC re. training of Groundsman in this connection. Chairman proposed that the following quotations for inspections be accepted:- KCC £25 per visit - 10 visits per year; Wicksteed Leisure £25 per visit - 6 monthly. Agreed. Pavilion: There is extreme concern about recent vandalism to the pavilion roof by young children who do not live in the village and who are under the age of 10. A budget price for new tiling to the front elevation of the roof in the sum of £2,500 was received. Advice will

be sought from the insurance company. Tennis court lighting: A scheme of lighting and quotation in the sum of £9,100 was received from LTL Contracts. The Tennis Club has been advised and copies of the letter will be given to Parish Councillors. For further discussion at the next RGMC meeting. Boundary land: Subsequent to ground works being carried out on adjoining land by Croudace Ltd, Chairman and Clerk met their representative on site. Boundary line was established and agreed – this line will be fenced by Croudace. Noted that one Parish

Council owned tree will be replanted.
